## TAVISTOCK CUP PLAYERS GIVE BACK

*Team Isleworth donates \$1 million to local and international organizations*

**ORLANDO, Fla.** – The 2008 Tavistock Cup culminated with a victory by Team Isleworth, giving the eleven players the tournament purse as well as an additional \$1 million to be donated to the charities of their choice.
