Rose chooses to keep money local in Central Florida community

The 2007 Tavistock Cup culminated with a victory by Team Lake Nona, giving the team of ten players the tournament purse as well as an additional \$1 million to be donated to the charities of their choice. Justin Rose of Team Lake Nona was the first to reveal his gift, which he chose to keep in the local community, to Central Florida Children's Home.

Rose, a resident of Lake Nona Golf & Country Club, donated his entire charitable gift of \$100,000 to Central Florida Children's Home, an organization located one mile outside Lake Nona which cares and provides for children who otherwise do not have a home.

Previously, Tavistock Cup, through the Tavistock Foundation, donated \$500,000 to a selection of charities, however this year's tournament was different and each player had the opportunity to hand-select the charities that received the monetary gifts.

"My wife Kate and I are so excited that, because of the Tavistock Cup, we are able to get involved in Central Florida Children's Home and really make a difference in the lives of these children and in the Central Florida area," said Rose.

The donation made to the Home will contribute to several projects such as the installation of a putting green and golf net with weekly lessons provided for the children by golf professionals in the area. Other projects include new furniture for the living room and dining area, a new basketball hoop, grill and kayaks for the outdoor area, and extending the living quarters to add a quiet study room and playroom.

Central Florida Children's Home, Inc. was founded in 1973 by Eastland Baptist Church and cares for children whose parents either cannot or will not provide for them due to difficulties in the child's life or difficulties in the parents' lives. A Christian atmosphere and "home" setting with a "mom and dad" give a secure environment and needed love to the children.
